The purpose of the Spanish VAP is to cover the equivalent of an intermediate level college Spanish language course. Students enrolled are expected to have practice both formal and information Spanish communication skills throughout their previous years of study as the course is conducted entirely in Spanish. We will continue to develop proficiency in the target language through the exploration of Hispanic cultures while interweaving the basic skills needed for:

- > Active communication: aural comprehension through authentic and level appropriate audio and video media;
- Extensive interpersonal and presentational speaking: conversation starters and role play, debates and formal presentations;
- Comprehension and persuasion: using multiple sources of written materials such as conversations, newspapers, magazines, letters, internet articles, and short stories;
- Rigorous review and application of: vocabulary and grammar structures through frequent informal and formal composition assignments.

World Languages and Cultures Learning Objectives

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course provides students with opportunities to demonstrate their proficiency at the Intermediate to Pre-Advanced range in each of the three modes of communication described in the ACTFL Performance Descriptors for Language Learners.

Students are expected to:

- Engage in spoken interpersonal communication;
- Engage in written interpersonal communication;
- Synthesize information from a variety of authentic audio, visual, and audiovisual resources;
- Synthesize information from a variety of authentic written and print resources;
- Plan, produce, and present spoken presentational communications; and
- Plan and produce written presentational communications.

General Advice:

This class is taught in Spanish, therefore use your summer vacation to practice your Spanish. The following is a list of suggested resources:

- ✓ Spanish TV channels (Univision, Telemundo)- Watch the news, game shows, or *telenovelas* (highly recommended!) in Spanish
- ✓ Radio programs- Listen to local Spanish language radio stations (107.9 FM, 700 AM, 730 AM, 1050 AM). You can also check out music on Spotify or Batanga (a Spanish language Pandora equivalent).
 - o <u>www.rtve.es/radio/</u> Spanish national radio on-line with a variety of channels from which to choose.
- ✓ Magazines, newspapers- Pick up a copy of a Spanish language newspaper or go online and connect to "El Tiempo Latino" a Spanish language *Washington Post* publication. Note the differences in news coverage between US and Latin American/Spanish news outlets.
- ✓ DVDs- Set the DVD language to Spanish or run the Spanish subtitles. Better yet, watch a Spanish film. There are a ton of films available on Netflix and Amazon (with parent approval please!)
- ✓ Books- Check out the Spanish language books at the library (don't forget the children's section as well).
